BASIC INFO

- Chicago mission days are a day of service at the city. Eighth graders and High school students are welcome. Middle school students can join us with their parents or an adult chaperone.
- Mission days include Mass, service in three or four mission sites, and the opportunity to go deep into the experience through sharing or a cine-forum.
- There is a \$35 registration fee which includes a mission cross, breakfast, lunch and dinner, as well as the mission staff and supplies needed in the different mission sites.
- Missionaries are required to wear a Mission Youth t-shirt or hoodie. If so desired, these can be bought during the registration process and will be given out the day of the mission.

- The mission starts at the Convent of the Missionaries of Charity and finishes at a location in the City to be determined (December) or at a location in the North shore to be determined (March). Transportation from site to site is provided by volunteer parents.

MISSION SITES INFO

Grace Place: The Homeless Ministry at the First United Methodist Church of Chicago serves a meal to between 150-200 guests each Saturday at Grace Place. At Grace Place, volunteers help with registration of guests, kitchen support, serving the meal, clothing donations, etc.

Missionaries' of Charity Soup kitchen: We'll be preparing and serving breakfast for about 60 guests, along with the Missionaries of Charity (Mother Teresa's Sisters).

Mobile Pantry with the Franciscans of the Eucharist at the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels: The Mission of Our Lady of the Angels establishes a Catholic presence in the West Humboldt Park area on Chicago's west side, one of the poorest neighborhoods in Chicago. The purpose of the Mission is twofold: to assist the materially poor and to share the treasure of our Catholic Faith. The Mission currently provides fresh produce, non-perishable food, clothing, and household goods to about 250 families each month at the Mobile Pantry. <http://www.missionola.com/>
